

Today we begin the season of Advent, which marks the start of a new liturgical year for the Church. The readings for Sunday Mass are arranged on a three-year cycle. Each year features a different Gospel—Matthew, Mark, or Luke. Readings from the Gospel of John are interspersed throughout all three years. With this year's first Sunday of Advent, we begin Cycle B of the Lectionary, which focuses our attention on the Gospel of Mark. This week and next week, our readings from Mark's Gospel present two important Advent themes: the Lord's return at the end of time and John the Baptist's preparation for Jesus.

Today's Gospel is taken from the end of Mark's Gospel, the chapter that immediately precedes Mark's account of Jesus' Passion. Having been questioned repeatedly by the scribes and the Pharisees, Jesus is now questioned by his disciples—Peter, James, John, and Andrew—who want details about his prediction of the destruction of the Temple. Jesus answers with many warnings about the difficulties that the disciples will face.

Today's passage comes at the conclusion of Jesus' warnings to his disciples. Jesus emphasizes the need for watchfulness. The Son of Man will come without warning; only the Father knows the exact hour. The disciples must not be caught unprepared when this time comes.

Scholars believe that Mark's Gospel was written around the time of the destruction of Jerusalem by the Romans in A.D. 70. Mark's audience consisted of Christians who were living in difficult social and political times, times of conflict. They were likely beginning to face persecution as followers of Jesus. In this difficult time, it helped to recall that Jesus had foretold of such difficulties. Early Christian communities took courage from Jesus' warning to remain alert and watchful, and they found in his words a way to persevere through suffering.

Today's Gospel reminds us that Advent is about more than our preparation for the Church's celebration of Christ's birth at Christmas. Advent is also about preparing ourselves for Christ's return in glory at the end of time. Like the disciples and the faithful in Mark's community, we must also stay alert and watchful. Our faithfulness to God, through the good times as well as the difficult times, shows us to be ready for the coming of the Son of Man.

Dziś rozpoczynamy okres Adwentu, który rozpoczyna nowy rok liturgiczny w Kościele. Czytania niedzielnej Mszy Św. ułożone są w cyklu trzyletnim. Każdego roku przedstawiana jest inna Ewangelia – Mateusza, Marka czy Łukasza. Czytania z Ewangelii Jana są przeplatane przez wszystkie trzy lata. Pierwszą w tym roku niedzielą Adwentu rozpoczynamy cykl B Lekcjonarza, który skupia naszą uwagę na Ewangelii Marka. W tym i przyszłym tygodniu nasze czytania z Ewangelii Marka przedstawiają dwa ważne tematy Adwentu: powrót Pana na końcu czasów i przygotowanie Jana Chrzciciela dla Jezusa.

Dzisiejsza Ewangelia pochodzi z zakończenia Ewangelii Marka, rozdziału bezpośrednio poprzedzającego relację Marka o męce Jezusa. Wielokrotnie przesłuchiwany przez uczonych w Piśmie i faryzeuszy, Jezus jest teraz przesłuchiwany przez swoich uczniów — Piotra, Jakuba, Jana i Andrzeja — którzy chcą poznać szczegóły dotyczące jego przepowiedni dotyczącej zniszczenia Świątyni. Jezus odpowiada wieloma ostrzeżeniami dotyczącymi trudności, jakie napotkają uczniowie.

Dzisiejszy fragment kończy się przestrogami, jakie Jezus skierował do swoich uczniów. Jezus podkreśla potrzebę czujności. Syn Człowieczy przyjdzie bez ostrzeżenia; tylko Ojciec zna dokładną godzinę. Kiedy nadejdzie ten czas, uczniowie nie mogą zostać przyłapani na nieprzygotowaniu.

Uczeni uważają, że Ewangelia Marka została napisana mniej więcej w czasie zniszczenia Jerozolimy przez Rzymian w roku 70 AD. Słuchaczami Marka byli chrześcijanie żyjący w trudnych czasach społecznych i politycznych, w czasach konfliktu. Jako naśladowcy Jezusa prawdopodobnie zaczynali doświadczać prześladowań. W tym trudnym czasie warto było przypomnieć sobie, że Jezus przepowiedział takie trudności. Wczesne wspólnoty chrześcijańskie nabrały odwagi po przestrodze Jezusa, by zachować czujność i uwagę, i w jego słowach znalazły sposób na wytrwanie w cierpieniu.

Dzisiejsza Ewangelia przypomina nam, że Adwent to coś więcej niż tylko przygotowanie do kościelnej celebracji narodzin Chrystusa w Boże Narodzenie. Adwent to także przygotowanie się na powrót Chrystusa w chwale na końcu czasów. Podobnie jak uczniowie i wierni we wspólnocie Marka, my również musimy zachować czujność i uwagę. Nasza wierność Bogu, zarówno w dobrych, jak i trudnych chwilach, pokazuje, że jesteśmy gotowi na przyjście Syna Człowieczego.



The Mass is the New Testament sacrifice in which the Lord Jesus, under the forms of bread and wine, offers Himself to His Father for us.

In the Mass, the same sacrifice that the Lord Jesus offered to the Heavenly Father on the Cross for our sins is repeated. The difference is only in the way it is offered. On the cross, the Lord Jesus offered Himself in the form of a man in a bloody way, that is, He suffered and died; and in the Mass, He offers Himself in the form of bread and wine in a bloodless way, that is, He does not suffer and die. Both on the Cross and in the Mass, the Lord Jesus offers Himself to God the Father; but in the Mass, He offers Himself through the hands of the priests.

And so it will be until the end of the world. This was strongly emphasized by the Second Vatican Council when it recalled that the Savior "instituted the Eucharistic Sacrifice of his Body and Blood in order to perpetuate in it the sacrifice of the Cross for all eternity until His coming."

The Mass is offered by the priest as an offering to the Lord God the Father on behalf of all the faithful, that is, the entire Church. By offering this sacrifice, the Church worships God in the most perfect way.

All who belong to the Church can enjoy the fruits of the Mass and unite their intentions with those of the Church. The Church recommends that the Mass be offered not only for the living, but also for the souls in Purgatory, because by offering this Sacrifice they will sooner be reunited with God in Heaven.

The Holy Mass is always celebrated as a sacrifice for the glory of GOD.

On Sunday, November 12th, the children and youth of our St. Alphonsus Liguori School and Religious Education Program, along with their parents, actively participated in such a Sacrifice.

The Mass was celebrated by Father Steven Dombrowski - Associate Pastor, assisted by Deacon Mike Platt.

In his homily, Father Steven referred to the words of the day's Gospel, which tells of the five wise and five foolish virgins who awaited the coming of the Bridegroom.

Father Steven spoke to the children about the importance and value of the oil and its significance in our lives. He also asked everyone to close their eyes for a moment and think about what they are thankful to God for. He asked that especially during the upcoming Thanksgiving holiday and Advent time, we thank God for all the graces we have received.

After Mass, everyone was invited to a sweet treat sponsored by families in our Religious Education Program.

We thank you all for your great participation in our monthly Family Youth Mass and wish you many God's blessings.


